Montessori Tip for Home

Spend a few minutes near a wildflower garden with a child and you'll observe how the marvel of nature inevitably captivate and engross the child. In a carefully prepared outdoor environment, children are free to move about the space and have plenty of opportunity for spontaneous observation.
