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hospital. This seizure was so severe Sawyer had to be intubated and placed in a medically induced coma.

When he awoke, Sawyer had to relearn how to sit up, stand, and crawl. After this hospitalization Sawyer continued to have seizures. When he was fifteen months old, Sawyer finally received a diagnosis: Dravet Syndrome, an incredibly rare and serious form of epilepsy. There is no cure and treatments are difficult. During Sawyer's young life he has had over forty ambulance trips, more than 75 days in the hospital, and has been intubated five times. He is currently on five different medications and can still suffer from around 100 small seizures per day. His family must be constantly prepared for him to have a large seizure.

Sawyer and his family are still searching for a treatment that will better his quality of life and ease the constant burden of his disease. Receiving a difficult medical diagnosis like Sawyer's is overwhelming and often terrifying, for the child and everyone who loves them, especially their family. **That's where the support of Child Life Specialists – and your gifts - come in.** Child Life Specialists are trained professionals with expertise in helping children and families overcome life's most challenging health related events. Whether providing education about medical procedures in developmentally appropriate ways to patients or their siblings or engaging in age appropriate distractions and play during difficult medical procedures, our child life team **prevents and reduces trauma and stress for children as they move through treatment.** They also provide emotional support for families. They can help siblings cope and understand how to support their brother or sister in treatment, and they help with memory making, grief and loss support in terminal cases. They do these things and so much more, and because they work with all our pediatric patients aged from birth to 18 years, they work across many units both in and outpatient. Your gifts in support of the child life specialists at providence helps support the nearly 17,000 children served by the hospital each year to provide developmentally appropriate toys and tools to assist children and families, ease their way, help them play and reduce the stress and trauma of hospital stays.
